

Arundel is what every child imagines a castle should be. It has battlements and towers high on a hill overlooking the rolling South Downs hills. At almost 1,000 years old, the castle has seen wars, royal visits, extensive restoration works and the invention of electricity – Arundel was one of the first English country houses with electric light. Today, the castle is filled with 16th-century furniture, tapestries and historic artworks.

Don't miss the exquisite suite of bedroom furniture that was specially made for a visit by Queen Victoria and Prince Albert in 1846. The castle has a busy calendar of living history events, too.

- Getting there from Gatwick Airport: Arundel Castle is 40 miles (60km) southwest of Gatwick Airport. Travel times are approximately 50 mins by road, or 50 mins by rail to Arundel station then a 20-min walk.
